



THE ADDAMS ANCESTORS

THE BRIDE: LOLA FRUMP (1910-1928)

She was an eccentric witch, very gregarious with her imagination. Creating enchantments and potions to survive the wicked time in which she lived. Post fiery demise at the stake, her true reality shines through of her time in Bloomingdales Insane Asylum, in which enraged, she set aflame.



THE COWBOY: SAM ADDAMS (1865 - 1890)

Sam was the undertaker of a small town in New York, and was commonly known as the fastest hammer in the west. He was able to have a coffin built and in the ground before its occupant was able to get room temperature. When a new sheriff came and brought peace to the chaotic town, suddenly the death toll dropped to zero and Sam got antsy. One day the sheriff was taking a nap in a field and Sam eagerly mistook him for being dead and built him a coffin and threw him in the ground in record time. However, when the sheriff awoke, he rang the safety bell and the town realized what had come to pass and hunted down Sam. He was hung for his crimes from the local hanging tree. It is said that that tree is now the ancestral tree on the Addams' property



THE FLIGHT ATTENDANT: BETTY BLOOMSTEIN (1922 - 1962)

Betty led an incredibly hick existence (even by hick standards) until her niece, Morticia encouraged her to see more of "life" - whatever that might be! Having fostered within her a love for adventure and violence, Betty went on to travel the world as a flight attendant/gangsters' courier. Sadly, her predilection for a tipple or seven slowed her reactions so that she was unable to remove herself from the path of an errant drinks trolley on a particularly turbulent flight from Amsterdam to Dubai, thus inadvertently becoming the inspiration for Ram Jam's one-hit wonder, "Whoa Flat Betty, Bam-a-Lam".



THE GANGSTER: RICARDO "L.A" ADDAMS (1902-1929):

Notorious for his cannibalistic tendencies, this elusive gang member struggled for his chance at the American Dream when his abusive father would lash his anger on his mother. In the heat of the moment, a delicate carving was all it took to obtain his begetter's heart. He later went in search of one who would embrace his darkness. Luckily, the mafia was on his side. Unluckily, one failed bank heist stripped him away of his life at the peak of his career. Now he awaits those who find themselves infatuated with anyone and anything to gain what was rightfully his.



THE ROMAN SOLDIER: TIBERIUS ALBERTUS IL LUPPO ADDAMS (71 BC - 247 AD)

Second cousin of the shewolf, Capitoline, made him werewolf-ish, giving him strength, longevity, and fleas. He enjoyed life in a hedonistic matter, enjoying simple pleasures like wine, war, parties, and setting things on fire. (The great fire of Rome was his handiwork). In his lifetime he buried 3 emperors, saw Rome burn, and partied in the Coliseum...and it was there where he drank one too many and fell from the balcony, not the best way to go but at least he partied till the end.



THE BASEBALL PLAYER: LOU ADDAMS (1901-1921)

A tragic case of being in the wrong place at the wrong time, Lou was a loose end in a betting scam against his own team and was poisoned before his career making game. He got his revenge in the end by seeking out and viciously ending any and all bloodlines responsible for his demise.



THE ADDAMS ANCESTORS



THE CAVEMAN: KI MI PALA (40,000 YEARS AGO)

The first ancestor of the Addams family is well known by the scientific community as Homo Stupidus. His name means: Who, What, Two. He lived in the Eurasia zone where he hunted species such a woolly mammoth where he found his end when he tried to ride it, but he was unfortunately squashed by the big animal. One of his biggest achievements is the creations of pockets, cause in everything else he was a recipe for disaster.



THE CONQUISTADOR: CAPTAIN GENERAL REDONDO VENTANA LAGUNA DON JOSE CUERVO (1676-1725)

He would like to be remembered as an explorer, a leader of men and lover of women. Unfortunately, posterity will remember him as an incompetent, authoritarian commander whose romantic level was more Keaton than Casanova. His amorous ambitions were clearly not totally unsuccessful as he contracted syphilis and died a painful, disfigured death.



THE PIRATE: ROBBIN JACKY CUERVO (1675-1695)

The daughter of a sailor for the Spanish flag and older sister to Redondo Ventana Laguna Don Jose Cuervo. She was recruited by the First Mate of the Queen's Masterpiece. She sailed with the Queen's Masterpiece until it was over run by an enemy ship and she was strapped to a canon and tossed to Davy Jones Locker at the bottom of the sea.



THE FLAPPER: GINGER ST-CROIX (1889-1927)

Aspiring author, dancer, drinker, smoker. The life of the party, always looking for the latest gossip in her hotspots around NYC. She was orphaned as a child and took frequent trips to Paris to look for her birth relatives, but to no avail. She led the single gal life, quite the choice bit of calico, but wouldn't be handcuffed to any man. It was a night on the town that ultimately did her in, having too much fun and careening about town in a Model T.



THE SALOON GIRL: FREYA ADDAMS (1857-1885)

An instigating, secretive saloon dancer who loves to start bar fights and rob men of their fortunes, that is until she met Juan Addams who lured her away from her pedestrian routine and into a dangerous outlaw existence. They married, but before they could have children and settle down on their large stolen "inheritance", they both met their end in a large shoot-out where Freya was shot gruesomely and killed.



THE EGYPTIAN: AMNERIS (1050-1028 BCE)

Amneris wasn't born into royalty but of course being who she is, she sees herself as an Egyptian goddess which gets her into a lot of trouble! Love captured her heart at a young age, which led to a devastating heart break and her untimely death. In her plot of revenge she was dramatically pushed into someone else's tomb. Being trapped with an unknown soul can drive someone mad!



LISA AUTON (ADDAMS ANCESTOR)

Lisa feels privileged to join the talents within FRC, and is excited for her debut performance. Originally from the UK, Lisa discovered her love for dance and musical theatre at the age of 3 into her late teens. 

New to live theatre? Well. WELCOME!

Of course, going to watch a theatre show is a lot different than going to watch a film as there are specific rules that you need to follow in order to ensure uninterrupted experience for everyone. So, since you are at a theatre, here are 5 dos and don'ts of theatre etiquette to keep in mind:

The Dos of Theatre Etiquette

Understand and respect the rules of the place

Every theatre, though different in architecture and size has its own set of rules. If you understand and respect them, then it will make for a wonderful experience. However, undermining them can cause quite a hassle not only for yourself but also for others. So, it is always better to go through the rules of the theatre before you enter the building.

Dress for the Occasion

Watching a show in a theatre is a special experience so, it is necessary for you to dress properly. A general guideline is to wear an outfit which matches the price of your ticket. Even though there is nothing wrong in wearing casual attire but to attend a show wearing a sweatshirt or leggings does look a little out of place. It is fine to wear comfortable clothing but make sure that you look polished.

Arrive on Time

If you plan on watching a theatrical performance of your favorite show then please make sure that you arrive on time. Punctuality shows that you respect the actors as well as your fellow theatregoers. Plus, make sure that you use the restroom before you take your seat or during the intermission. Getting up and going during the performance will cause disruption. And, of course, anyone who leaves will unfortunately be unable to return.

4. Applaud at the Right Time

While watching a theatre show, it is really important to applaud at the right time. If you are attending a musical, then it is best not to clap during the song. Sometimes, a song will be transitioned into a scene. In that case don't clap until the scene is over or the next song ends. If you are watching a play, then the appropriate time to clap will be when the scene ends. You should definitely applaud at the conclusion of the show whether you like it or not as this will help raise the morale of the actors and the entire team.

5. Respect the Actors

One should always be appreciative of the actors. These people withstand the hottest and brightest of lights while wearing heavy costumes to make your experience memorable. On top of that, they perform live day in day out and that alone deserves a lot of respect because it is not easy. Oh, and they are all volunteers with day jobs, and are doing this for the love of theatrel

The Don'ts of Theatre Etiquette

1. Avoid Using Flash Photography

Taking a picture in a dark place with the flash on can be disturbing, especially for someone who is totally focused on something else. So, if you take a picture in the theatre during a performance, it can distract the actor and their performance could suffer. It can also be a safety issue – please help us keep our performers safe!

2. Do not sing along with the performers

It is normal to feel the urge to sing with the actors on stage but doing this will simply disturb the entire ambiance. You have to respect your surroundings and must realize that you are watching performers performing on the stage and that you are not at a concert. However, if you are asked by the actors themselves to sing along, that is a different matter altogether.

3. Don't make noise (or a mess) with food and drink

Unwrap any cough drops or candy before the show begins, and do not eat potato chips, pretzels, or any other crunchy snack during a live performance. The only sounds one should hear at a performance should be coming from the stage! If you happen to spill a drink, please let one of our Front of House staff know as we'd be happy to clean it up for you!

4. Don't Fall Asleep and Don't Talk

Whenever you plan to watch a show on stage, make sure that you are well rested and not tired. Snoring during the show does not help anyone. Plus, do not fidget around and stop talking once the performance begins because that is a major distraction.

5. Avoid Using Your Phone

Please don't use your cell phone while watching the show. You can turn off your phone when you enter the theatre or simply put it on silent mode and turn the brightness down. If you use your phone during the show then there is a pretty good chance that you will be asked to stop doing that.
