

It was 1989 and I had just finished my first year working in the world of theatre when a jazzy, very 'un-musical theatre' film noir musical burst onto the Broadway scene. Cy Coleman, David Zippel and book writer Larry Gelbart - who never much liked the way he and other screenwriters were treated by their bosses - had created a film come musical that aired his grievances swathed in bebop and ballads. The musical had taken eight years to write, opening night had to be delayed due to set issues, and the show received polarizing reviews due to its approach and some of its content.

All this has made the production one of the most awarded but least produced shows in the musical theatre world – and for some good reasons. *City of Angels* is a musical-comedy-thriller that honors the Hollywood films of the '40s while trashing the system that spawned them. 'Angels' mixes its sweets with bitters such as when Stine refuses to play ball anymore, the director asks, "Is this some kind of New York snot-nosed revenge?" and really, one can ask that about the entire show as Zippel's lyrics can be as caustic as Gelbart's book. When it finally opened, the show's 27 actors brought their roles to life in their '*real*' and '*reel*' worlds, and did so through a staggering 46 scene changes. Today you will see a cast of 20 take up this challenge.

To say that this is a complicated musical would be a great understatement – as at its core, *City of Angels* is much more a film script that has been gifted to the theatre world. In film, you can have the luxury of taking the time you need to set, dress and light each of this shows 46 locations individually in order to get just the tone and look desired. When you translate this film idea to the stage however ... well, then the bottle that Stone and Stine keep in their desk gets used a lot more.

All that said, *City of Angels* is an absolutely fantastic, and original, evening of musical theatre and story-telling. I have been blessed to have worked with a truly fantastic cast to bring this story to life, and while - like the original production - we have had more than our fair share of challenges in getting this show to opening night, their attitude has been truly admirable. Alongside them, the FRC design and production team has put in countless long days leading up to the show and we hope you will agree that all the blood, sweat and yes, tears, have been truly worthwhile.

To our production team and to our great band - thank you. To our stage management team, Danielle and to my constant collaborator on this project, Ashley - thank you. To my family, who puts up with all of this – thank you. And finally, to our amazing cast – thank you for bringing this great story to life.

Enough from me...but I will leave you a quote from the great Larry Gelbart, who had this to say about creating *City of Angels*, "*Musicals are monsters*. *There's so much involved in terms of getting the technical aspect right while still remembering why all that technical business is going on. It's like trying to housebreak a dinosaur.*" Thank you for joining us and for climbing aboard musical theatre's very own dinosaur ride!

LYNN KOLLING (KEYBOARD 2)


This is the fourth FRC show that Lynn has played in. She enjoys the music and loves to play all sorts of sounds on the keyboard. Kudos to the singers and musicians.

Best known for writing the long-running TV series M*A*S*H, the gift of provoking laughter came early to Larry Gelbart and never deserted him. His distinguished career as a writer of comedy reads like a history of the art. His foray into Broadway began with A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, and he won a Tony Award for Forum and a Drama Desk Award for City of Angels. Larry passed away from cancer in 2009.



CY COLEMAN (MUSIC)

Born in New York City in 1929, Cy Coleman was a composer who collaborated to produce hit songs and scores for several landmark Broadway musicals, including *Wildcat* (1960), *Sweet Charity* (1966), *On the Twentieth Century* (1978; Tony Award, best original score) and *Barnum* (1980). In the 1980s, Coleman wrote film scores and composed the music and lyrics for the musical *Welcome to the Club* (1989). In the '90s, he won additional Tonys for *City of Angels* (1990; best musical, best original score) and *The Will Rogers Follies* (1991; best musical, best original score).



DAVID ZIPPEL (LYRICS)

Falling in love with the theatre as a child, Zippel first articulated his life's ambition to become a lyricist and director in junior high school. Zippel first obtained a J.D. degree from Harvard Law School. Zippel wrote the lyrics for the Disney films HERCULES, with music by Alan Menken, and MULAN, with music by Matthew Wilder. The music and lyrics received an Academy Award nomination for Best Musical or Comedy Score and won an Annie Award nomination for Music in an Animated Feature Production.
